#### **Capital Campaign Update**

As the leaves turn and the chill of autumn settles in, the Hillside SPCA is excited to share significant updates on our ongoing capital campaign! Over the past several months, our dedicated team, supporters, and volunteers have come together with a shared vision: to expand our facilities, enhance our services, and ultimately provide a better life for the animals in our care. Thanks to the commitment of our community, we are thrilled to announce that we have reached several key milestones.

The new Barb Umlauf Welcome Center was built in July of 2022 and provides a calm, quiet setting for adopters to become acquainted with the pet they have come to possibly adopt. We opened the new Spay/Neuter Clinic in September of 2023 and just hit 1000 spay/neuters about two weeks ago. It is our goal to grow the clinic and expand our services to the community as we are able to. The Big Dog building now has all new, modern kennels, fans, and

new ductless mini split systems for a/c and heating and we recently were able to complete an irrigation project that will prevent our kennels from flooding, as they have done in the past.

We still need a generator installed to ensure the animals have heat when the power goes down and we can still fully function. We also have the renovation of the Small Dog Building, the Cat Building and the Julian Room ahead of us so we have made much progress, but we still have much to do. As we move forward, we remain committed to our vision of a modern, welcoming space for our shelter animals and the surrounding community. With your help, we are one step closer to achieving that goal. We encourage everyone to stay engaged and informed about our progress. Together, we can ensure that every animal receives the love, care, and forever home they all deserve.


