Launching a Legacy

Hillside SPCA launches a Capital Campaign to fund a Veterinary Spa Neuter Clinic, which will provide access to low cost veterinary services to the general public as well as reduce the overall operating costs for the shelter. The project came about when the current Veterinarian, Dr. Andrews, learned of the shelter's long term goal of establishing an onsite clinic and agreed to partner. "Being able to provide medical services on site is a tremendous opportunity for both Hillside and the community," said Board President Donna Boyd.

In addition to the creation of a fully operational medical facility, Hillside will construct the Barbara Umlauf Welcome Center and replace 38 dog kennels as well as windows and doors.

Lasting Legacy with a Bequeath to Hillside

The family of Minna Kliebenstein (former Minna Naundorf, then Barto) generously donated the plot of land upon which their family homestead resided at 707 West Market Street. The home, which was originally purchased in 1958 by Elvin and Minna Barto, was sadly destroyed in a fire and demolished in 2018. Minna's family decided it was fitting to donate the plot of land to Hillside SPCA, in honor of their mother's support and admiration for the work the shelter does on a daily basis. Minna loved her home and the people and pets who lived there, whom she faithfully cared for there until her passing. This donation is a tribute to Minna's selfless generosity of spirit and her caring kindness that she extended to her pets.

"Hillside SPCA is, thankfully, the recipient of bequeaths from the estates of dedicated supporters of the animals that find their way through the shelter doors and that generosity is a God-send," said Board Vice President, Ron Brown. The shelter has utilized the funding bequeathed to them to pay operating costs



as they are almost exclusively funded by donations.









POLO'S SPECIAL SOMEONE

Polo came to the shelter in the fall of 2021 as a stray at about 4-5 weeks old. He was your typical playful kitten that stole the hearts of everyone he met. After a couple of months of being at Hillside, he was seen by the local vet. Polo was diagnosed with Pemphigus which is an autoimmune disease of the skin. Treatment would require immunosuppressive medication. He improved on the medication and was able to be put up for adoption as a special needs kitten.

On April 23, 2020. Polo was adopted by John

and Michele

specifically came
just for him.
They understood
his condition and
wanted to give
him the best life
possible for as
long as they
could. They



named him Joey and would frequently send updates on how he was doing.

This past summer, Polo (Joey) became very ill and had to be taken to an emergency vet hospital where he spent the next 5 days. Several tests, medications and even a blood transfusion later John and Michele were given news they certainly did not want to hear. Polo's (Joey) Pemphigus had progressed and they also learned he had bone marrow cancer. Knowing he didn't have much time, they took him home to spend as much time as possible with him. The next day he passed away with his family and as sad as they were, they told the shelter staff how thankful they were for the time they had with him.

It takes a very special family to take on a pet with such challenging medical needs, but those that do are truly heroes. Our thoughts and sympathy are with the Woellner Family as the mourn the loss of their beloved pet.
